

MINISTER'S LETTER

Having reported last month on our having hosted an important service for the Priory of Scotland of the Order of St John, this month it's the turn of the Scottish Parliament which held its annual service here in late March. Actually it was only the second time it's happened, but two years in a row is probably enough to make it an annual event! It all started as an initiative from the Moderator of the General Assembly. Every year the Moderator visits the Houses of Parliament in London and preaches at a special service in the chapel at Westminster. But on their annual visit to the Scottish Parliament at Holyrood there was no such opportunity to share in a church service. Which is where we come in, with the recent service led by The Revd Fiona Smith, Principal Clerk, readings given by Alison Johnstone MSP, the Parliament's Presiding Officer and a sermon preached by The Right Revd Shaw Paterson, Moderator. Attended by a number of MSPs as well as members of the wider staff at Holyrood, it's a good way to remind all concerned of our role as Parish Church for the Scottish Parliament.

Recently members of the local community were asked to help choose three new quotes to be added shortly to the Scottish poetry stones set into the Canongate Wall of the Parliament complex. If you haven't noticed them before, they're well worth a look. My favourite has long been Alan Jackson's "What a lovely moon; and it's in the constituency too!" I suppose it's intended to reflect a politician's feeling that everything revolves around their particular territory. But it also brings to everyone a sense of distant things still being relevant to us, wherever we are. Like Easter, for instance. Originating in a time long ago and a place far away, it could all seem too remote, too distant, to have any impact on us here and now. But like the moon in the constituency - and remember the date of Easter is determined by the moon – our annual commemoration of the death and resurrection of Jesus speaks to us of Christ's sacrifice and God's limitless love for each one of us in our own place and our own time just as much as it did all those centuries ago in Jerusalem. Every year in our Holy Week and Easter services we find the powerful answer to a question once asked by the Psalmist:

When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established; What are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them?

Once you have registered for Gift Aid, so long as you use the same card, you will not be asked again.
