

MINISTER'S LETTER

Every December we seem to add another charity carol service to the calendar and this year is no exception with St John Scotland lining up a particularly stylish event for Thursday 19th at 7pm. Music will be provided by the "St John Choir" led by the distinguished Aberdeen composer and conductor Paul Mealor LVO CStJ. Paul rose to prominence when his music was sung at the wedding of the (now) Prince and Princess of Wales in 2011 and his reputation as a royal favourite was confirmed when his music was also sung at national services of thanksgiving for the late Queen Elizabeth II, at The King's Coronation in Westminster Abbey and at the Presentation of the Honours of Scotland in St Giles' Cathedral a few weeks later. And now he's coming to Canongate Kirk! The Lord Provost's coming too and there will be a collection taken in aid of his One City Trust. The service will be a traditional blend of carols for choir and congregation, interspersed with readings of the Christmas story, and members of our congregation will be more than welcome to join local members of the Order of St John, whose premises in our parish are currently undergoing a major refurbishment. I'm particularly keen to encourage this new opportunity to develop links with the Order, which I hope will become an annual fixture in our seasonal schedule. That's not to say members of the congregation wouldn't also be welcome at some of our other charity carol services, held in aid of the Army Benevolent Fund, the Royal British Legion Scotland, and Crisis. Details of these can be found later in this newsletter. And of course there will be our own diet of Christmas services to look forward to, beginning with our Lessons and Carols at 10.30am on Sunday 22nd December, when in another new connection we shall be joined by friends from the Edinburgh Royal Warrant Holders' Association. Then our usual Watchnight Service at 11.30pm on Christmas Eve, and the Family Service at 10.30am on Christmas Day. All welcome, always!

Some of the words of our most familiar carols might seem incongruous when we consider all the sorrow and suffering in and around the Holy Land these days. But the sentiment behind them surely stands as strong as ever:

WASHBAGS FOR CRISIS AT CHRISTMAS

We have once again been asked to help supply washbags to Crisis, the local charity for the homeless. These can be brought to church or handed in at the church office up to and including Sunday 22nd December. Gender neutral washbags are preferred however this isn't always easy to achieve so male and female washbags would also be welcome. These can be filled with any selection of toiletries, but no razors, or hand sanitisers which contain alcohol. A suggested list of items includes shower-gel, soap, shampoo/ conditioner, toothpaste, toothbrush, flannel and anything else you would usually find in a washbag.

CHRISTMAS APPEAL

The Kirk Session has agreed that this year we will support the Moderator's Challenge 'Let Your Little Light Shine', supporting the work of the Church of Central Africa to provide solar power, through light libraries in CCAP Primary Schools and solar panels for the new PhD centre at Zomba Theological University. A solar light costs just £10. The appeal will run via retiring offerings at all our services from Sunday 22nd December through to Sunday 29th December. TRUSSELL TRUST

Further to our support at Harvest, when we supplied a carload of stuff and a cheque for £500, we continue to collect donations for Edinburgh foodbanks supported by Trussell Trust. Non-perishable foodstuffs and toiletries can be brought any Sunday and left in the basket in the foyer.

STAMPS

As Christmas cards begin to drop through the letterbox, don't forget that we have had an ongoing collection for used stamps for many years. According to the Church of Scotland's World Mission Council, all stamps collected are first sorted into their respective denominations and then sold on to collectors and dealers from all over the world. The money raised is then used to support charities in developing countries. This year's Stamp Appeal proceeds will go towards the Church of Central Africa Presbyterian project Firmly Planted, which aims to establish self-sustaining tree nurseries to nurture and protect the environment and protect livelihoods for households and communities in Malawi. This year's appeal will continue on from last year and will go towards establishing the nurseries.

KIRKYARD WINTER TOURS

Each tour explores a different theme with the first focusing Canongate Kirk's royal connections from David I to Charles III including legends and facts, royal gifts, royal servants and more. ST MARGARET'S DAY

A special service was held in Canongate Kirk Saturday 16th November, St Margaret's Day. Usually on that day a series of short services is held in St Margaret's Chapel in Edinburgh Castle for members and guests of St Margaret's Chapel Guild, but this year as part of the 900th anniversary of the establishment of the Royal Burgh of Edinburgh by King David I (Queen Margaret's son) the service was held in our own Kirk of Edinburgh Castle. Supported by the St Margaret's Singers and shared with the Most Reverend Leo Cushley, the Right Reverend John Armes and the Very Reverend Colin Sinclair representing the Roman Catholic Church, the Scottish Episcopal Church and the Church of Scotland respectively. The service reinforced our connections with St Margaret's Chapel Guild and the tiny chapel that bears her name in the upper reaches of our parish. Later in the day, a special interfaith service was hosted by Rev David Coleman of Eco-congregation Scotland in conjunction with Christian Aid, marking the COP29 Global Day of Action.
