

MINISTER'S LETTER

Monday 1st July 2024 sees the adoption of the Basis of Parish Grouping as previously agreed by our Kirk Session and congregation and finally by the Presbytery of Edinburgh and West Lothian at its meeting on 18th June. This is the formalisation of the closer collaboration with our friends and neighbours at St Giles' Cathedral towards which the Presbytery has lately been encouraging us, and which began with our first united evening service on Advent Sunday 2022. These monthly services continue to attract a reasonable congregation drawn from both churches and beyond. And will continue to provide a focus for our closer collaboration on the Royal Mile. In addition, the Basis of Parish Grouping encourages us to establish other areas of co-operation, building very much on the historic roles and responsibilities of our respective churches. These will include mission and outreach to locals, visitors and tourists, those who attend concerts and special events, and the many major institutions and organisations based on and around the Royal Mile. To help bring our congregations closer, a joint study group will take place twice a year and occasional joint fundraising activities for local charities will be undertaken. There's talk at the Cathedral of a Young People's Group gathering from time to time – these days in the Church that means under forties (!) – and a warm invitation is extended to interested and eligible parties in our congregation, who should get in touch with our office prior to a lunchtime gathering proposed for early August.

Canongate Kirk has always styled itself the Kirk of Holyroodhouse and of Edinburgh Castle. Its obvious proximity to the Palace explains the former connection, but reasons for the latter are lost somewhere in the mists of time. They may have to do with an ancient connection between monastic foundations situated both at the top and at the foot of the Royal Mile as early as the twelfth century. Today this means that both the eastern and western edge of St Giles' parish boundaries march on those of Canongate Kirk. So we've always been close geographically, and the Parish Grouping just brings us a bit closer together in other ways. But we'll be continuing to do our own thing too. We've revived a Pastoral Care Group, for instance, with a number of willing volunteers happy to call (in person or on the phone) on those members and friends of our congregation who might appreciate such a connection. Again please let the office know if you, or someone you know, might appreciate a call.

If yes, just follow the steps on the screen. Once you have registered for Gift Aid, so long as you use the same card, you will not be asked again.
