

MINISTER'S LETTER

The last few days of February saw an unusual flurry of activity at Canongate Kirk. We welcomed a bigger congregation than usual to our monthly evening service, with friends from churches beyond Canongate and St Giles' joining us to hear Rev Stewart Gillan, the minister of St Andrew's Jerusalem, reflect on life in and around that military memorial church at this turbulent time. Monday saw an invasion of young soldiers, who filled our pews for a national competition organised by the Royal Corps of Army Music. A sequence of nine instrumental soloists competed for the top prize, accompanied by a huge band which combined the forces of the Royal Regiment of Scotland and the Light Division among others. By Wednesday we were reduced to two trumpeters, a piper, choir and organ to support another large gathering for a special service to install the new Prior of the Order of St John's Priory of Scotland in the presence of its Grand Prior, HRH The Duke of Gloucester, after an impressive procession down the Canongate from St John House. On each occasion our church provided an appropriately bright and welcoming space that was much appreciated and admired.

Looking ahead, the Kirk Session has agreed that we will hold a Lent Study Group in the church beginning on Sunday 9th March and concluding on Sunday 13th April. The group will meet in the King David Aisle at 11.30am and finish before 12.30pm, when parking restrictions on the Royal Mile kick in. We will follow a book produced by the Church of Scotland entitled "Living Generously", copies of which are available at £10 each, or can be ordered online. Offering what is described as a "whole-life response to God's love", the book incorporates a series of articles, case studies and discussion prompts as we travel towards Easter and its reminder of God's own generous and unconditional love for the world in the life and death and resurrection of Jesus. All are welcome, both to the Study Group and to our morning services as Lent unfolds.

Stewart Gillan reflected on how Palestinian Christians have found life-saving shelter literally within their church buildings, when they have either found their homes in Gaza to been destroyed or to have been occupied by other displaced neighbours. We live in less extreme times, but are glad to find life-enhancing opportunities within the walls of Canongate Kirk and the bright and welcoming space it provides.

Once you have registered for Gift Aid, so long as you use the same card, you will not be asked again.

We are grateful to everyone who supports the church financially in the variety of ways, including contactless, that are now available. Many members of the congregation still prefer to put something in the offering bags when they are passed around during the service.
